
Women's Retreat for All Who Identify As Women Friday, February 2 - Sunday, February 4, 2024

Here is a chance to sing a familiar French carol tune with new words, the most important clearly being "Love." The senses "seen and heard" (as in Acts 4:20 and elsewhere) organize the first two stanzas, while the third holds the summary statement: "Love is the gift of Christmas."




"Nowell" is the English form of the French "noel," a shout of joy formerly used at Christmas (as in Chaucer's "Franklin's Tale"), a clue that the word is older than its first printing. It may have Latin and French roots related to "born" ($natus \mid n\acute{e}$) as well to "news" ($nava \mid nouvelle$).


